

Martín holds the position of electric mobility & B2B director at Cooltra and has always been interested in clean energy and recycling, envisioning electric vehicles as an important part of the solution for climate change and pollution in big cities. The sustainable businessman holds a bachelor's in economics from Universitat de Barcelona and has completed a postgraduate course in finance management from Universitat Pompeu Fabra.



Cyberclick David Tomás, Co-Founder & CEO *Corporate Responsibility Award*

Cyberclick specializes in online lead generation through online marketing and digital advertising. Cyberclick is an SME consisting of five companies and, after many structural changes and the application of new business management concepts, Cyberclick has been voted the best place to work in Spain two years running. Cyberclick is a horizontal organization and has created multidisciplinary teams composed of mathematicians, engineers, advertisers, journalists and business professionals, with no middle management or hierarchy. 

Deputy Director of the Geneva Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Services *Commencement Address*

Vincent Subilia currently serves as deputy director of the Geneva Chamber of Commerce. His responsibilities include overseeing the arbitration and mediation services provided by this institution. Previously, he held the position of economic development officer of the State of Geneva.

Adolf Ogi

Former President of Switzerland & Founder of Freude Herrscht Foundation *Commencement Address*

Born in the Swiss village of Kandersteg, Adolf Ogi completed his studies at the Ecole Supérieure de Commerce in La Neuveville, Switzerland and attended the Swiss Mercantile School in London, going on to become the director of the Swiss Ski Federation and managing director of Intersport Switzerland. He shifted from business to politics in 1979 when he was elected as a representative for the Canton of Bern at the Swiss National Council.

During his time in office he was a key player in departments including the Federal Department of Transport, Communications and Energy, Civil Protection and Sports. He was elected president of the Swiss Confederation in 1993 and 2000, and in 2001 was subsequently appointed as special advisor on Sport for Development and Peace to UN Secretary General Kofi Annan. Additionally, he is chairman of the advisory board of the Swiss Economic Forum. Ogi currently focuses on humanitarian and charitable organizations such as Freude Herrscht, which he founded in honor of his late son, Mathias Adolf Ogi.





Abdoulaye Yero Baldé Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Republic of Guinea Doctor Honoris Causa

Abdoulaye Yero Baldé has extensive professional experience in government, academia, international organizations and the private sector spanning over 20 years. He served as first deputy governor of the Central Bank of Guinea from 2010 to 2015, a position in which he was in charge of economic, monetary and foreign exchange policies, banking and financial supervision. Prior to 2010, Baldé served as director at Guinea Alumina Corporation, a company involved with the development and financing of a \$5 billion alumina refinery project in the Republic of Guinea.

From 1996 to 2002, he was an economist and operations officer at the World Bank. In this position, he worked on the formulation and implementation of macroeconomic operations and development programs as well as on *s*pecific capacity building projects.

Among his other achievements, Baldé was a lecturer at the University of Conakry in the Republic of Guinea. He holds a MBA in finance from Columbia University in New York, and both a master's in economics and a master of advanced studies (DESS) in project management from Paris-Sorbonne University.



Richard Saint Marché Managing Director of The Saint Bernard Pass Charitable Foundation *Doctor Honoris Causa*

After graduating from university in the United States, Richard Saint Marché began his professional career as a serial entrepreneur. Within days of having graduated, he moved to Las Vegas, Nevada to purchase a business in the entertainment industry. In a short period of time, Saint Marché met and struck a business partnership with his future wife Christina, a booking agent at the time.

The company expanded its music and showroom bookings beyond Las Vegas to Los Angeles and then to China, Europe and finally Canada. Signature Entertainment specialized in music and touring acts but soon moved into professional sports broadcasting, as well as becoming a dominant company in the fashion television industry.

In 2001, The Saint Bernard Pass Charitable Foundation was formed to assist in the bulk movement of fresh water worldwide. Over the years, the foundation has drilled wells, built treatment facilities and exported ice melt to the areas of the world in desperate need.



Distillery Louis Morand & CIE S.A. Accepted by Jean-Pierre Morand, on behalf of his father Louis Morand, Honorary President *Family Business Award*

Established in 1889 in Martigny, the Distillery Louis Morand & CIE S.A. produces high quality brandy from the fruits and plants of the Canton du Valais, one of the 26 cantons in Switzerland. More recently, the company expanded into the field of spices and bio herbal teas under the brand name Grand Saint Bernard.

In 1958, when Louis Morand took over a flourishing but still local business from his energetic father, André, the brandy Williamine[®] had just been launched. Over the next three decades, it grew steadily, pushed forward by the sheer strength of its extraordinary flavor. The secret is in the quality of the Williams pears grown in Valais. To transform them with respect, care and finesse, into a pure eau de vie has been Louis Morand's life achievement. He succeeded in turning Williamine[®] into a true Swiss symbol.

Having been the soul of the company for more than 50 years, Louis Morand has now left it in the hands of a fourth generation, and is overseeing the new challenge it faces: to continue forging ahead on a 127-year-old road.









Yannick Guerdat CEO at Artionet S.A EU Alumnus Entrepreneurship Award

Yannick Guerdat is a Swiss entrepreneur and CEO of Artionet. In addition, he is the manager of the show jumping Olympic gold medalist, Steve Guerdat, in charge of his communication and sponsorships. He completed his Bachelor of Science in information systems at EU Business School in 2008 and earned a master's degree from the Swiss Association for Leadership Training in 2012. He is also a member of the executive committee at Alp ICT Information Technology Group and vice president of the Club of Young Entrepreneurs in Switzerland.

Founded in 2001, Artionet is a web agency specializing in providing customers with superior SEO, web design, content management, e-commerce, social networking services and more. Artionet has just launched a new range of products in e-governance, ranging from the digital signature to pure online services. Their goal is to simplify and rethink the business processes of any company that wants to become digital.

The United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) has been working to improve the wellbeing and promote the rights of children across the globe since its creation in 1946 in response to famine and disease facing children after World War II.
